Sarvnaz Alambeigi (Maydegol, director)



Sarvnaz Alambeigi is an Iranian multidisciplinary artist best known for documentary filmmaking and painting. She graduated from Graphic Art School and studied painting at the University of Art and Architecture in Tehran. She received film training from 2013 to 2018 at Documentary Campus Masterschool and Danish Film School. In 2013, she founded her own film company, Rabison Art. Alambeigi's most notable work is 1001 Nights Apart, a documentary released in 2022 in Germany that won the VFF Documentary Film Production Award at DOK.fest Munich. It was shown in cinemas across Germany in 2022, as well as on TV channels such as Arte, SVT, TVO and Avrotros. She is currently a member of Film Fatales, The European Women's Audiovisual Network and the Association of Iranian Documentary Cinema Directors.

Nouf Aljowaysir (Where am I From?, director)



Nouf Aljowaysir is a Saudi new media artist examining our changing behaviours and interactions with algorithms. By navigating intimate questions with AI tools and challenging their conventional utility, her work uncovers their underlying training logic and capitalist motivations that shape their outputs and influence our perspectives. Her work has been displayed in galleries and festivals globally, including Centre Pompidou, Museo Tamayo, CPH:DOX, Tribeca Film Festival, and others. Her latest film, *Where Am I From?*, won the 2023 Lumen Prize Moving Image award and was recently released with The New York Times Op-Docs series in June 2024.

Daniël Bakker (Pocket Change, director)



Daniël Bakker (Netherlands, 1995) directed several short films before attending the Netherlands Film Academy, including *Touch the Leather*, which premiered at Nowness and was selected for the Netherlands Film Festival. In the third year of the Film Academy he directed *Zonnestorm*, a nuanced character driven film. In addition, he directed the SIRE commercial VAKMENS that won the Camelot commercial prize. Daniel graduated with the film *Pocket Change*. Daniel's films are intimate and recognizable with flesh and blood characters. He wants to make physical films in which the youth and teenage years play a major role.




Franco García Becerra (Raiz, director)



The second feature film of Franco, *Raíz/Through Rocks And Clouds* (2024), made its world premiere at the 74th Berlin Film Festival and was awarded with the Special Mention in Berlinale Generation Kplus. It was also selected in the Open Doors section and the Director's club of Locarno Film Festival and was awarded the International Jury Prix for Best Direction at Lima Film Festival 2024.

His short film *Lima* received the Best Short Film and Best Screenplay Award from the Ministry of Culture of Peru in 2011 and won the best short film award at the Peruvian Film Festival in Paris in 2013.

Zohra Benhammou (*Rupture*, co-director)



Zohra Benhammou is a Belgian-Moroccan filmmaker from Brussels. Drawing on her background, she delves into the subtleties of personal narratives and family heritage. Through her work she aims to convey the nuances of culture, religion and identity, weaving connections that bridge different realms and fostering understanding. Benhammou debuted with the mid-length documentary *Rupture*, created in collaboration with Younes Haidar. Her latest work, the feature documentary *Ana* + *Yek* (*Me* + *You*), co-directed with Romy Mana, had its world premiere at Gent Film Festival this year.

Grace Biot (Julie Keeps Quiet, actress)



Born in 2005, Grace made her film debut with the role of Laure in *Julie Keeps Quiet*. Driven to embrace new challenges each time, she brought the character Laure to life in Leonardo's first feature film full of energy. In addition, Grace is a passionate tennis player, active at national level in the highest women's series 1. She succeeds in combining this sport at a competitive level with her academic career as a second-year student of commercial engineering at KU Leuven.

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Tessa Van den Broeck (Julie Keeps Quiet, actress)



Tessa Van den Broeck (° 2006) participated in a casting for the first time and was chosen from a whole series of young tennis players by Leonardo van Dijl to star in his feature debut *Julie Keeps Quiet*. The film had its world premiere at the Semaine de la Critique in Cannes in 2024. This was Tessa's first step in the film world. She is currently in her second year of nursing at UCLL University of Applied Sciences. She shares her passion for tennis as a club referee and 'Start to Coach' at Tennis Flanders. Since 2013, she has developed her tennis skills at various academies, including the Kim Clijsters and Justine Henin Academies, and continues to pursue her love for sports at TC Panorama in Overijse.

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Domenico Cricelli (Donna Sola, producer)



My professional career has been characterized by significant progress in the field of media production. From May 2020 to March 2024, I held the role of Executive and Financial Producer at The Storytellers Srl, where I was responsible for creating production budgets, financial plans, managing regional Film Commission grants, tax credits, and the overall organization of projects such as the short films Mazarol and Donna Sola. Between 2010 and 2020, I worked as Artistic Director and Manager at HARP S.r.l. in Bologna, where my responsibilities included organizing music festivals, financial and accounting management, payroll administration, and much more. This position allowed me to develop skills in staff management, staff training, order management, stock control, and the organization of weekly and extraordinary events. Previously, from 2016 to 2018, I worked as Production Manager for Sara Scamarcia Produzioni,

specializing in the production of web content for Unipol.

Elise Debruyne (On the 8th Day, co-director)



Elise Debruyne, graduate of the 3D Pole (Roubaix, France). In 2021, she co-directed the short film *Ah les crocodiles*. Then in 2023, she co-directed the short film *On the 8th day*.

Fien Donckers (Onderweg, director)



Fien Donckers (2001) is the screenwriter and director of the short film *Onderweg*, her master's thesis at Sint-Lukas. Her bachelor film *Schemer* was selected in 2022 for the Leuven Short Film Festival. Her work focuses on themes such as growing up, femininity and friendship. She shapes her stories with a focus on details from everyday life.

Nicolás Escarpentier (Where am I From?, producer)



Nicolás Escarpentier is a non-binary immersive media artist and producer with extensive experience in interactive and emerging media. Born in Chile and based in Brooklyn, they specialize in creating multi-layered pieces, seamlessly blending diverse forms of media technologies to create rich storytelling experiences. Deeply focused in stories about belonging and identity, Escarpentier's projects explore how these facets are performed both in physical and digital spaces.

Currently, they have been leading and producing several emerging media projects. These projects have been showcased all around the world, including the International Documentary Film Festival Amsterdam, Tribeca Film Festival, the UN's HLPF, Games for Change, and more.

Marie Falys (Between the Others, director)



Marie Falys, originally from Belgium, discovered cinema as a teenager and developed a passion for it. As soon as she finished secondary school, she began studying filmmaking at the IAD in Louvain-la-Neuve. During her two years at master's level, she co-directed a fiction film featuring a strong female character: Aurore. Then, for her graduation film, she made an intimate documentary about a young teenager in search of herself. In early 2024, she directed a short film in collaboration with Elles Tournent: Les Gueuses. She is currently working on her next short film.

Eric Goossens (Fox and Hare Save the Forest, producer)



Eric Goossens is a co-founder of Belgium's acclaimed animation studio, Walking The Dog, established with Anton Roebben in 1999. The studio excels in both traditional and CGI animation, with its works including names such as "The Triplets of Belleville" (2003) and "The Secret of Kells" (2010), both Oscar-nominated. Its portfolio includes "A Monster in Paris," "The Congress," "Jack and the Cuckoo Clock Heart," "Another Day of Life," "Where is Anne Frank," "Richard The Stork 2," and "Fox and Hare Save The Forest." Upcoming releases feature "The Magnificent Life of Marcel Pagnol" by Sylvain Chomet and "Outfoxed!" by Paul Bolger.

Younes Haidar (Rupture, co-director)



Younes Haidar is a 32-year-old self-taught film director and camera operator currently based in Brussels, Belgium. Born to a Belgian mother and a Moroccan father, he grew up in a small Flemish town near Brussels. After missing the enrollment deadline for film school, Younes studied literature at KU Leuven. Upon completing his studies, he began working as a freelance TV journalist. Frustrated by the dominant voice of mainstream media—often portraying marginalized communities negatively without telling their side of the story—he turned to documentary filmmaking as a way to give a voice to the oppressed.

Together with Zohra Benhammou, he co-directed, shot, and edited the documentary TV series *Generatie BX* for the Brussels regional broadcaster Bruzz. Both filmmakers discovered a shared passion for telling the stories of

stigmatized youth, many of whom come from migration backgrounds. Their cinematic debut, *Rupture*, is the outcome of this shared vision.

Phil Hawkins (Robin and the Hoods, director)



Phil Hawkins is a feature film and commercials director from the UK. His work in film includes the family action/adventure ROBIN AND THE HOODS starring Naomie Harris & Gwendoline Christie and PRANCER: A CHRISTMAS TALE starring James Cromwell for Universal Pictures. He also wrote and directed the world's most expensive Star Wars/Indiana Jones fan film STAR WARS: ORIGINS which has over 2.5m views and has been critically acclaimed as an "epic masterpiece".

Ineke Houtman (*The Book of Everything*, director)



Ineke Houtman makes feature films and television programs. *Madelief, krassen in het tafelblad, Polleke* en *De Indiaan* were shown at many festivals, including Berlinale, and received many prizes. *Madelief, krasen in het Tafelblad* was the Dutch entry for the Oscars. *Mijn Opa de bankrover, Toen was Geluk heel gewoon* en *De Ontsnapping* all three received the 'Gouden Film' award. In addition to making feature films, Ineke also directed series such as *Dokter Deen* en *Zwarte Tulp*.

Ineke's penultimate production is the telefilm *Matties*, which received the prize of the children's jury at both the Cinekid festival and the Barnefilm festivals in Kristiansand, Norway. *The Book of Everything*, based on a beautiful book by Guus Kuijer, was shown in Malmo and Kristiansand and was published in the Netherlands on October 10, 2024.

Anna Huix (Girls Move Mountains, director)



Anna Huix is a director and photographer who lived and worked in Paris, New York City and London. She graduated, with honours, at Parsons School Of Design in New York City. After living abroad for 12 years, she moved back to Barcelona, where she keeps on working for leading international publications and advertising firms. Her work has been exhibited in art spaces such as The State Hermitage Museum in Saint Petersburg. She specializes in portraiture & travel.

Her editorial clients include The New York Times, Time, The Wall Street Journal, Financial Times, The Guardian, Sunday Times or The Telegraph amongst others. Her commercial clients range from Google and United Bank Of Switzerland to Visa, Airbnb or Nespresso.

Anna has worked in Pakistan several times. She finds the country and its people fascinating. She went to the Karakoram Mountains Range for the first time 13 years ago and fell in love with the area. Some other highlights in her career are creating work while sailing the Arctic or documenting Buzkashi in Tajikistan.

Neyrouz Jemour (Nina's Friend, director)





Thomas Leclercq is a Belgian animation director and cartoonist from Brussels, Belgium. His films are often made with a deep sense of nostalgia and try to tell a story to the child that remains in each one of us. His most recent one, *The Genie in the Bottle*, reminds us that with a bit of imagination, adventure is just around the corner.

Bert Lesaffer (The Night Tunnel, director)



Bert Lesaffer (°1983) is the co-founder, creative producer and screenwriter at Animal Tank, a production company and animation studio based in Belgium. Animal Tank has produced short films that were selected at Berlinale, Annecy, Fantoche, SXSW and Clermont-Ferrand, and have been nominated for European Film Awards twice.

Bert supervises screenplays in different stages, discusses artistic choices with directors/screenwriters and gives feedback where needed. As a screenwriter, he worked on the animated shorts *Oddland* (2022) and *The Night Tunnel* (2024) and has some shorts, features and series in development.

Bert's background is in psychology and psychoanalysis, theater and film. He wrote and directed five plays with Stuurs

Opzicht, worked at MEDIA Desk Flanders and the Flanders Audiovisual Fund and was KASKcinema's programmer and communication manager for seven years. He currently also works at School of Arts Gent as a teacher in the film department and as ombudsperson and confidentiality advisor.

Leif Lindblom (The Pinchers' High Voltage Heist, director)



Leif Lindblom, born in 1967 in Södertälje, is one of Sweden's most successful directors. He has primarily directed TV series, but made his debut as a feature film director for cinema in 2007 with *Solstorm*. He has made a lot of successful humor series for television, and feature films.

Deepak Lohana (The First Film, co-writer)



Deepak Lohana is a graduate of R.A. Podar College of Commerce & Economics and holds a PGDM in Marketing from SIES College of Management Studies. He co-wrote the acclaimed FTII student film *The Real Millionaire* which was nominated for the International Grand Prix at the Clermont-Ferrand International Short Film Festival and screened at over 75 film festivals worldwide. He won The Indian Express Film Award for Best Script. His latest short fiction, *The First Film* for which he co-wrote the story, screenplay, and dialogue, premiered at BOGOSHORTS in Colombia and won 'The German Star of India - Audience Award' at the Stuttgart Indian Film Festival.

Liza De Maeyer (Somewhere in Between, director)



Liza De Maeyer graduated at the Royal Institute for Theatre, Cinema & Sound in Brussels in 2024. Prior to her audiovisual arts studies, she graduated as a sexologist at the KU Leuven. In her work as a documentary filmmaker she tries to use her knowledge as a sexologist to tell real stories that are vulnerable at times but that nevertheless need to be told.

Alicia Massez (On the 8th Day, co-director)



Alicia Massez, graduate of the 3D Pole (Roubaix, France). In 2021, she co-directed the short film *Vent d'hiver*. Then in 2023, she co-directed the short film *On the 8th day*.

Dominique Mertens (Field Mushroom, director)



Since 2000, Dominique Mertens has dedicated himself entirely to illustration. In 2001, following his selection at the Bologna fair, he released his first album in England. Others followed. He works with the traditional technique of watercolor. Nature has always been his favorite subject. He is active in both the youth illustration sector and in didactic/naturalistic illustration. For some years, in parallel with his work as an illustrator, Dominique has been passionate about wildlife observation and animation. Since 2022, he has directed 4 short films which have all been selected in numerous festivals in Belgium and internationally. *Field Mushroom* is his first animated film.

Joren Molter (Summer Brother, director)



Joren Molter graduated from the Netherlands Film Academy with the film *Greetings from Kropsdam*. This graduation film was selected for 54 international film festivals, including prestigious festivals such as Clermont-Ferrand, Busan, and Palm Springs. The film won 13 international awards, including the Audience Award at the Warsaw International Film Festival.

Joren was the first Dutch director selected by the European Film Promotion for "Future Frames: Ten New Directors to Follow" at the Karlovy Vary Film Festival. His TV film Dòst was bought by Amazon and translated into 27 languages, making his work accessible to a global audience.

His feature film debut, *Summer Brother*, was widely acclaimed and won the Dutch Critics' Award. The film was nominated for four Golden Calves (the Dutch Oscars) and

won the Audience Award at the Translavia International Film Festival (TIFF). Additionally, *Summer Brother* took home the main award at the Giffoni Film Festival.

Mari Monrad Vistven (Todd & Super-Stella, director)



Mari has been working as a filmmaker for Norwegian and English television for about 20 years. She has experience from both documentaries and fiction films, commercials, and music promos. She has also worked as an editor for documentary series for Norwegian TV. Mari has also worked as a stills photographer for Elle, Aftenposten, Dagbladet and Redwood Publishing in London.

Stephen Owino (Jump Out, actor)



Stephen is an actor, acrobat, stuntman, filmmaker and a painter from Nairobi, Kenya. He is currently based in the Netherlands. His inspirations in arts started while he was young. He found it easier to communicate and express himself through arts. With less resources around he became a self-taught artist. Having grown in a less privileged community his aim was always to give back to the community. He has been part of both philanthropic and artistic organizations and projects within Nairobi and Europe. For over 10 years Stephen has performed and participated in numerous projects, circuses and shows all over Europe. The documentary *Jump Out* is centred around one of Stephen's artistic projects within the less fortunate neighborhoods of Nairobi, Kenya.

Alexandra Pärn (Happy Things, director)



Alexandra Pärn graduated from the Baltic Film, Media, and Arts School (BFM) at Tallinn University in 2024, specializing in film directing. The short films Pärn made during her studies, *Smalltown Miss* (2022) and *Christmas Day* (2023), have successfully participated in many festivals (PÖFF Shorts, Ale Kino!, Filem'On, Münster Filmfestival, Fish Filmfestival, Weihnachtsfilmfestival Berlin, Ińskie Lato Filmowe, among others) and have received significant attention and won awards. She has also been working as a freelance AD in multiple films and TV series and is currently working at a casting agency.

Anneke de Lind van Wijngaarden (Sweeties, director)





She conceptualized the yearly Cinekid MediaLab, 1200 m2 full of installations, games and apps for children, seen by the industry as the place to be to get updated on new tech and media innovation.

In her previous jobs as Head of departments of Dutch Public TV-networks she gained knowledge of the media industry and of cultural programming and reaching out to the young audiences. As a former curator of the Royal Tropical Institute and the head of Tropenmuseum jr, she is an experienced exhibitions developer with a focus on (interactive) vis a vis audience relations. Naeyé gives talks, is invited for consultancies and festival juries in several continents, member and/or founder of many foundations and adviser of funds, script doctor, media developer. She focused her entire career on impact and quality. Currently she is working for a cooperative to support biodiversity and nature inclusive agriculture.

Levan Dvali (ECFA Documentary jury)



Beyond his role with the Taoba International Youth Film Festival, Levan is actively engaged in various professional endeavors aimed at advancing film art and cultivating a young audience. In 2023, he was honored with membership in the Georgian Film Academy.

Additionally, Levan Dvali serves as a member of the steering group of the EU digital education initiative, DigiEduHack. In this capacity, he leverages his expertise to contribute to the development of digital education and promote digital literacy among youth across Europe.

Koulukino develops film education and film literacy in Finland and promotes film screenings for children and young people in cinemas during the school day. Kovanen is currently a doctoral student at Tampere University and a member of the board of The Finnish Society for Cinema Studies, The Finnish Society on Media Education, and ECFA.

Doros Demetriou (CIFEJ Jury)



Doros Demetriou, born in Nicosia in 1970, is a cinema historian, event organizer, and film screening curator. He is a member of the European Children's Film Association (ECFA) and an elected member of the Director's Board of the International Centre of Films for Children and Young People (CIFEJ). Additionally, he serves on the Cinema Advisory Committee of Cyprus (SEKIN) and the Cyprus Board of Film Classification. As the manager and curator at the Cultural Workshop Agion Omologiton in Nicosia, he oversees film screenings, events, and education programs. Doros is one of the artistic directors of the 'Images and Views of Alternative Cinema' (IVAC) annual film festival and vice-president and event cura tor at the "Fotodos" Photography Club. He collaborates with the Cultural Services of the Ministry of Education and Culture of Cyprus on various film education programs, under the banner "The Power and Magic of Cinema."

Doros is on the Board of Advisors and a jury member at the British Columbia Environmental Film Festival (BCEFF) in Vancouver, Canada. He is also the Artistic Advisor, Director of International Development, and Youth Programs Manager at the Archeological, Ethnographic, and Historical (AEI) Film Festival in Nicosia. Since 2023, he has served on the Selection Committee for the National Program of the International Short Films Festival Cyprus and is the Media Coordinator for the 2025 Biennale Larnaca.

Doros lectures on cinema history and has studied Cinematherapy at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens. He co-founded the CineTexts webpage with Foivos Delivorias and produces radio content for OldTownRadio. He holds degrees in Electronic Engineering (BEng) and Visual Theories/Cinema (MA) from London.

Karen Vázquez Guadarrama (CIFEJ Jury)



Karen Vázquez Guadarrama was born in Mexico City and studied film at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Ghent, Belgium. Her short film *Mont d'Or*, her short documentary FLOR DE MIL COLORES and her long documentary WHEN THE BULL CRIED, were selected at several important international film festivals. Karen won the prestigious Camerimage for her work as a DOP. In addition to directing the film WE ARE FIRE about the Mexican cartoonist Maremoto, in the documentary series *Draw for Change*!, she was also the DOP for the Egyptian episode about Doaa EI -AdI.

Ema Pendiuc (CIFEJ Jury)



I am Emma Pendiuc. I am the founder and president of the first school of film and television for children in Romania, LITTLE STARS SCHOOL . I founded the school 14 years ago with the purpose of helping children aged 6 to 12 to put their artistic abilities into value and in the same time, become more confident and trust their own inner power. Since at that time the film industry for children in Romania was almost non existing we also had to produce the films in which our children played. We were providing acting and television courses for children in front and behind the camera. Therefore we started our own production company and since then we have produced over 50 films for children, short and medium artistic movies, all with educational messages. Seven of them were selected and participated in different sections of the prestigious Cannes Film Festival, but also in films for children festivals. Due to this performance, since 2012 I was elected twice as Vice President of CIFEJ and also member of the Board of Directors of CIFEJ. CIFEJ is the organization at world level of professionals in the industry of films for children and youth. I am

also a sociologist and mindset mentor and over the past 4 years, post pandemic, I enrolled many professionals in the mindset programs and I helped them to fulfill their goals and mission in life, including film professionals. In Romania I organize and host large conferences for teachers on the theme of mental and nutritional education for children, alongside our beloved cooking show for children "Little Stars in the Kitchen".

Els Kuiper (TV Jury)





Chantal Moens studied Film and Photography at the Luca School of Arts. Since the late '70s she has felt at home in the Film Museum. Since then she has explored just about all aspects of the film profession, ranging from editor for the Yearbook of Belgian film to film critic for various magazines or still press attaché and marketing manager in the film distribution. She has a preference for youth films, animated films and arthouse films. She has been a PR member of the UFK-UCC for decades.

Emilie Praet (Distribution Award Jury)

Christel Dequinnemaere (Belgian Short Film Award Jury)



Christel - after years in the entertainment sector (music, TV and corporate video) – ended up at SABAM at the end of April. Her task is to familiarize (potential) members with the ins and outs of Sabam. Sabam is the Belgian association for authors, composers and publishers. In 2023, the Woord & Beeld department distributed no less than 25.7 million euros with its 4 disciplines (audiovisual, literature, visual arts and performing arts). With the Sabam for Culture cultural fund, they support through scholarships, prizes and partnerships of many events, associations, students and members with the development of their careers. Similarly, Filem'On.

Caroline Daemen (Masterclass Audiodescription in Film)



Caroline Daemen has a degree in tourism and public relations. In 2004 she had severe eye problems and since then her vision has been deteriorating. She participated in the Art in the dark project and followed the museum guide course. She guides in various places for the blind and visually impaired and gives guest lectures on guide techniques for her target group in the guide courses. She is an active member of the culture network of the (European Blind Union), where she is mainly closely involved in the audio description project.

Mereijn van der Heijden (Masterclass Audiodescription in Film)



Mereijn is the owner of Soundfocus, a post-production facility specialized in accessible media. His company is involved with all the major audio description projects in the Netherlands. He started researching film accessibility for the blind and partially sighted during his MA studies in Music Technology (HKU) and his studies in Sound Design (MMus, Bournemouth University). Because of his background as a sound designer, the improvement of sound-quality is always an important factor in both production and research.

In 2013 Mereijn came up with the idea for Earcatch (a mobile application for audio description) because the Dutch film and broadcast industry couldn't provide a proper solution for an audience with sight problems. Earcatch was launched in 2015 and has become the industry standard for delivering AD in the Netherlands. In 2016 Earcatch received the Dutch Interactive Award and won a European Lovie Award.

Currently the app offers accessible film, tv and theatre in 12 different countries.

Joanna Ruba (Masterclass Audiodescription in Film)



Joanna Ruba (° 1980) is a knowledge assistant at the blind and visually impaired platform Symfoon. She has been visually impaired since birth and uses daily audio description.

Gert Vercauteren (Masterclass Audiodescription in Film)



Linguistics, Translation and Interpreting program of the University of Antwerp and is a member of the OPEN Expertise Center for Accessible Media and Culture. In addition to teaching, he focuses his research on making films and TV series accessible by means of audio description. In doing so, he looks at how descriptors can determine what they include in their description and at the impact of audio description on the cognitive load of the target audience. He has also worked as a professional audio writer for film and television for more than ten years. Based on the theoretical knowledge from his research and the practical experience as a descriptor, he regularly gives lectures and workshops for academics and the professional field.
